Abstract: Abstract of 50-120 words (10 pt, italic). The file with the instructions is available on the *SORGING* web page (<http://www.sorging.ro/ro/articole/instructiuni-de-redactare>). Use the file as a template for writing your paper.

Key words: List 5-8 keywords. (10 pt, italic).

INTRODUCTION (10 PT, CAPITALS, BOLD)

¶ (10pt)

(10 pt, normal) The paper has to be written in **English**. Its contents should be structured in the following way: problem description, application field, research stages, methods used, results, further research, conclusions, and references.

The paper has to offer the answers for the following questions: description of the problem, what is done by other people, what the authors did, what is new, what is my contribution?

2. INFORMATION

¶ (10pt)

2.1 Page layout (10 pt, bold)

- Use A4 format (210 x 297 mm)
- Margins: Top - 2,5 cm, Bottom, Left and Right - 2 cm each.
- Header - 1,25 cm; Footer - 1,25 cm.
- 2 columns, column distance 7 mm.
- The text should be written on one side of the page only.
- The paper has to be written in WINWORD format.
- Paragraphs: alignment - justified, line spacing – single.
- Fonts
 - Font style: Times New Romans.
 - Font size for:
 - paper title: 12 pt bold, capital letters;
 - author's name(s): 10 pt bold;
 - key words: 10 pt, italic;
 - chapter titles: 10 pt bold, capital letters;
 - subtitles: 10 pt bold, numbered, left aligned, upper and lower case;
 - text: 10 pt.; regular,
- Tab stop position: 5 mm.
- The paper must have between 4 - 8 A4 pages. In exceptional cases accept a maximum of 16 pages. Required number of pages must be an even number and the last page must be completed at a rate of at least 80%.
- Print with 300 dpi or more.
- No heading at the bottom of a column, without minimum 2 rows of subsequent text (else, push the headings up to the top of the next column).

- Use the maximum area for text.

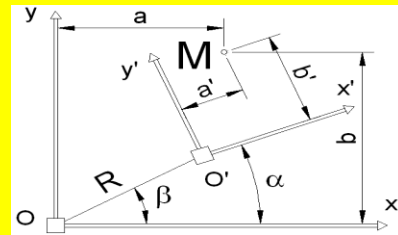


Fig. 13 Title of figure, center aligned.

3. FIGURES

¶ (10pt)

Figures have to be made in high quality, which is suitable for reproduction and print. Don't include photos or color prints. Place figures (center aligned) at the top or bottom of a column wherever possible, as close as possible to their first reference in the paper. Figures larger than the column width can be placed on the whole width of the page but only at the beginning or end of page. The text inside the figures and notations has to be 10 p. Figure number - 9 pt, bold, centered aligned, followed by figure title- 9 pt, regular.

3.1 Language, Stile Spelling

- Use common technical terms.
- Use concise and intelligible phrases.
- Use Spelling.
- The editor's requirements impose to consult an English translator or professor.

Tables should be placed as close as possible to their first reference. Table number - 9 pt, italic, right aligned, table title- 9 pt, bold, centered.

5. EQUATIONS

¶ (10pt)

Equations will be centered and numbered consecutively (right aligned). Use the equation editor only.

$$X_s = k \cdot u \cdot \sin \alpha_0 - \left(R_R + k \cdot m \cdot \frac{\pi}{4} \right) \quad (1)$$

$$Y_s = k \cdot u \cdot \cos \alpha_0 - \left(R_R + k \cdot m \cdot \frac{\pi}{6} \right) \quad (2)$$

$$Z_s = \lambda \cdot k \cdot u \cdot \sin \alpha_0 \cos \alpha_0 \quad (3)$$
